Men's Teams Report Summer 2026 and Winter 2025-26: Simon Fredericks

Summer 2026

We fielded 5 Teams this Summer and have had a very active summer of squash. As I write, with just a few matches to go, the 1st team (Captain Wayne Beglan) is currently 5th out of 8 Teams in Division 1. The 1st Team have had an excellent start to the second half with three wins on the trot and are currently sitting 5th. The 2nd Team (Captain Matt Jones) were promoted last season to a very strong Division 3B and despite picking up points along the way are currently sitting 8th but only 4 points behind the 7th placed team. It's been good to have the services of the former Redhill players which has boosted the 2nd Team considerably. The 3rd Team (Captain Guy Stedman) are 3rd in Division 5B and with three matches to play have a slim chance for promotion. The 4th Team (Captain Tom Jenkins) was a new Team designed to give our younger players more of an opportunity to play Team squash. The Team has done well and is currently 4th in Division 6B with 2 matches to go. The 5th Team (Captain Stuart Axson) was promoted to Division 6R and have found the standard a little too high. Despite some competitive matches, they are 7th in the league.

Winter 2025-26

It was great to see Reigate competing very successfully in the winter leagues for 2025-26. Reigate had four teams in the 2025-26 main Surrey Leagues winter season and had another excellent season of Team Squash. The 1st Team played some really nice squash and finished 4th in Division 3R. For some weeks it was a struggle to get a team out and thanks to Wayne for his perseverance as Team captain. It was good to finish with an excellent win against The Wimbledon Club. The 2nd Team finished 7th in a very strong Division 4B. Thanks to Tom Broekman for captaining the side for the last time and playing most games despite having a young family. The 3rd Team had a very respectable season ending up mid table (5th) in Division 5R. The 3rds had a strong start to the second half of the season with three straight wins but could not quite keep that momentum up until the end. The 4th Team were promoted to Division 6R and found it tough. Despite picking up points in all their matches, they ended up 7th.

Squash Leagues

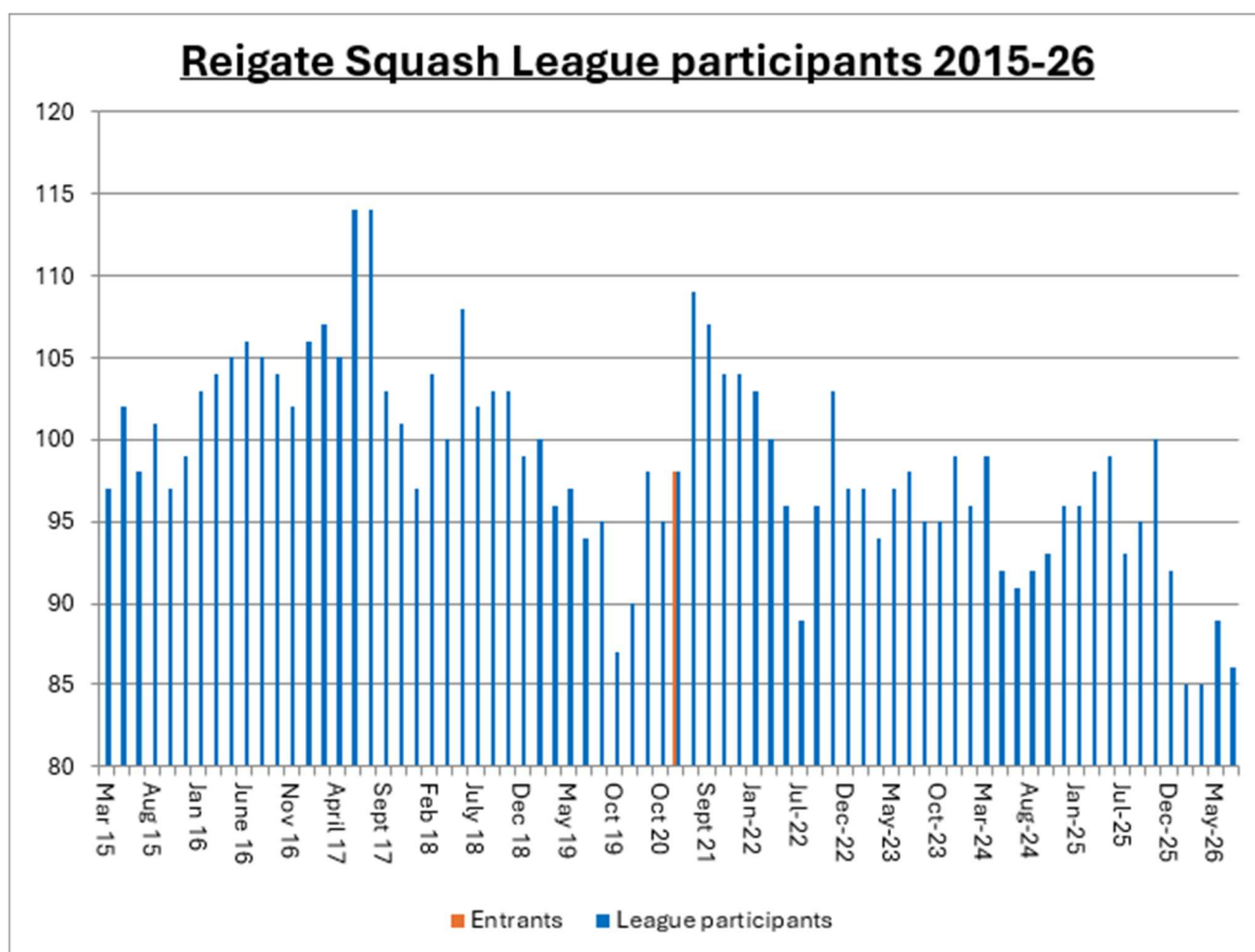

Junior Report 2025-2026: Danny Lee

There has been encouraging growth in junior squash at the club over the past year with 60 parents now on the Whatsapp group including some with multiple children.

Saturday squash sessions with Danny are spread over 3 and a half hours and consistently throughout the year have been attended by 17-25 children. The intermediate teenage group has been especially popular and everyone is improving whilst having fun.

Wednesday 4:30-6pm in term time has also had a healthy attendance with 3-4 beginners and 8-10 intermediate teenagers. Another group has started 5-6pm on Thursdays with 3-4 high potential 13-15 year olds.

I will be trailing a mini squash group for 4-7 year olds next term and this is the age group that needs to be targeted for further growth and to help retain more young squash players before they get entrenched in other sports.

Junior camps have been running twice a week in holidays and half term and attendance has been between 7-18 children over the three hour sessions. Charlie Lee has helped on a couple of occasions and several of our juniors joined in the recent clinics with him and Jonah Bryant.

Financial Report 2025-2026: Malcolm Gimblett

Over the course of the financial year ending June 30th, the club's expenditure and income closely matched each other and we ended the year with close to £144,000 in the bank. The refurbishment of the bar and kitchen areas plus external works required on the premises will cost a substantial sum, so the bank balance in the current financial year will decrease by a significant amount. However, the club's finances will still remain on a sound basis, even though the bank balance will be at a lower level than in recent years.

Audited accounts are posted on the club website and noticeboard.

Maintenance Report 2025-2026: Paul Phillips

In General:

The last twelve months has been taken up with planning and procurement of major works for the club. Routine maintenance is still ongoing, with little impact on the day to day running of the club or with impact to members.

We have defined the remedial works required to the external metal staircase, the external decorations and repairs are planned for September, as well as the major bar refurbishment project being procured and completed through August and September. We have also installed a filtration system on the mains incoming water supply.

Completed Works:

We have installed a new water filtration system on the mains incoming supply. This will ensure a good quality of water for the members, and removes any residual risks posed by historic lead pipework.

The planned works for late Q3 / Q4 2026 include:

- External repairs and decorations,
- Remedial works to the external emergency metal staircase and door lintel,
- Bar area refurbishment.

The external repairs and decorations have been tendered and quotes received. The works include for redecoration of all externally painted surfaces, the repair of faulty gutter joints, as well as replacing rotten timber fascias. Works are planned to commence in September, to align with the external staircase repairs.

A scope of works is agreed for the external staircase repairs, with Roger Crabb kindly providing the metal work repairs and a local contractor engaged to make good the external elevation. The work also includes the replacement of the defective lintel over the emergency exit door to the bar area. Once the metal work and external elevation works are complete the decorations will be commenced.

The Bar Area Refurbishment works are well underway. Design proposals have been reviewed and discussed, with many options being considered for the longevity of the area plus the needs of the various groups and events that will use the space. Orders are placed and works are being completed through September, with the target date for the bar to be re-opened on 26th September 2026. The refurbishment includes for new furniture, all new wall and floor finishes, as well as new light fittings, new kitchen and bar joinery and worktops, as well as a large screen TV.

We have brought the Fire Risk Assessment and Asbestos Management Plan for the Club up to date, and new surveys have been completed. Reports are issued and any remedial works are being implemented.
